

May each of us live our lives in such a way that generations after us will always have the Truth of God's unending love in their daily lives. God is a perpetual God. # A Note From Pastor Brad

## The hopes and fears of all the years...

"The Lord is near." – Philippians 4:5b

While I am late in getting this article to Amber (She is ever-patiently impatient with me!), I must admit that I was somewhat at a loss for what to write for this January edition of The Messenger. What sort of blessing might I share for a brand new year? What word of hope and encouragement could I muster that hasn't already been said? And then it dawned on me. I needn't write a new word of hope and encouragement – God has already given us all the hope and encouragement we need.

My beautiful wife, Lisa, shared with me a blessing she received from one of her Ukrainian students (she teaches English to Ukrainians as a means of sharing the love of God to a people under the great distress and persecution of war-torn Ukraine). It was a simple blessing from a wounded veteran that I share with you now:

*"I wish you strength in the coming year to face every lesson with dignity."* – Stanislav Hibadulin (aka "Stas").

Last night as I was preparing for our Watchnight Service (a simple Covenant Renewal Service put together by Rev. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement back in 1775), it dawned on me – We were just here a year ago.

What I mean by that is simple. One year ago, on New Year's Eve, we said goodbye to 2024 and wondered what 2025 would bring. None of us knew what to expect. We had hopes and dreams (always for the better), and while loathe to admit it, we also had fears and dreads, too. (There's a hymn line there somewhere, I believe.)

I called together Becky and Lisa for a quick prayer before our Watchnight service began. And as I prayed to God over this coming worship service, I realized in my own praying that the promise of God was never to make any particular year better than the last, only that God would be present in the midst of all that would come along. *"The hopes and fears of all the years are met in Thee tonight."*

And that's when it dawned on me. Our New Year's resolutions really only need to be one thing – to turn Godward, and trust that God's presence with us, in the midst of all that will take place, will be enough. That was God's promise in Isaiah 43, and that was His promise in that manger: *Immanuel - God is with us.*

As the old saying goes, "we don't know what the future holds, but we know who holds the future." Immanuel. As Paul so eloquently put it in Philippians, "The Lord is near."

And that is enough for me. What about you?



### Staff Christmas Party






